### Reimagining Casco Bay, Maine: Designing for Extreme Climate Events in Coastal Cities

URP 581/582 | ARC 627: Ecological Practices Studio

This interdisciplinary studio uses scenario planning to help citizens of Portland and South Portland, Maine to design their future in the face of urgent challenges from sea-level rise, recurring storm events, and deteriorating housing and port infrastructure. Scenarios show how to transition seven areas where these challenges converge through the lens of three important actions: grafting, connecting, and repairing. Through a unified cross-city framework and site-specific proposals, the studio reimagines Casco Bay's potential to redefine coastal urbanism and foster innovative approaches to collective habitation in the face of climate challenges.
